Funeral Held Apr. 20

Ida Blanch Hill of Wheatland, 91, passed away Sunday, April 17, at the Gra-Mar Manor Nursing Home in Scottsbluff, Nebr. after an extended illness. Funeral services were held Wednesday, April 20, at the Schrader-Prell Chapel with Rev. Elliott Graves officiating. Burial was in the Wheatland Cemetery.

She was born in Truro, Ill., October 14, 1885, the third child of George W. and Love Parker. She came to Wyoming in 1901 and homesteaded here with her family at the foot of Laramie Peak. She taught in rural schools in this area prior to her marriage to William Hill December 9, 1909. She and her husband moved to Wheatland in 1923 where they raised their family of seven children. She has recently made her home at Platte Manor Apartments in Wheatland until moving to Scottsbluff where she had been a patient of the Gra-Mar Manor Nursing Home.

In death she is survived by four sons, Frank of Riverton, Robert of Glenrock, John of Denver, and William Jr. of Lingle; three daughters, Mrs. Wallace Baker of Wheatland, Mary Anderson of Cora, Mrs. Clifford Reynolds of Thermopolis; one sister, Hazel McCullough of Fresno, Calif.; 20 grandchildren, and 19 great grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband, William, two sisters, Maude Sornberger and Ruth Ryan, three brothers, Samuel, William and Waverly Parker.
