## OBITUARY

Josephine Wheeler, the daughter of Bennett and Beersheba Newsom Wheeler, was born in West Virginia on March 19th, 1855 and departed this life at her late home in Wheatland, Wyo., on the 11th day of November, 1931, being at the time of her death 75 years, 7 months and 23 days of age.

Her father died when she was a child and at the age of nine she accompanied her mother to the state of Iowa locating near Indianola where she grew to womanhood.

She was united in marriage at Indianola to J.H. Hill on Sept. 23 1880 and to this union four children were given, three dying in infancy. She was also preceded in death by her husband on April 19th, 1930.

Among those who are left to mourn her death we note a daughter, Mrs. John W. Clark of Wheatland; a granddaughter, Mrs. Blair Judge also of Wheatland; and one sister, Mrs. S. W. Lee of Wick, Iowa, besides many other relatives and friends.

In the year 1872 Mrs. Hill while only seventeen years of age professed faith in her Lord and followed him in baptism thus uniting with the First Baptist church of Indianola, Iowa. She remained in the faith until she and her husband moved to Decatur, Iowa when she united with the Methodist Episcopal church of that place and again when moving to Wyoming she placed her membership in and was at the time of her death a member of the First M. E. church of this city.

Mrs. Hill has lived here in Wheatland for the past 14 years residing in the same house all the time and has gained a place of confidence in the hearts of all with whom she came in contact with and has impressed all that she was indeed a follower of her Christ.
