

HILLS, CYRUS WALKER
April 3, 1880-January 31, 1955

Final rites were held at the Schrader chapel here Wednesday afternoon for Cyrus Walker Hills, who died at a local hospital Monday, after a long illness, at the age of 74 years. The Rev. J.B. Milstead officiated at the services and Masonic graveside services were held at the Wheatland cemetery. Casket bearers were Preston Davis, Louis Manewal, Steve Black, Lorin Guild, Clarence Stumpff and Ron Williams.

A native of Rockland, Maine, Mr. Hills was born April 3, 1880. The first of this year he sold the hardware business which he had operated here since 1946 and retired because of ill health. He had been a resident of Wheatland since 1939, have been with the Buechner Drug for several years.

Mr. Hills lived at Casper from 1919 to 1930, where he was employed by the Smith-Turner Drug company and at Cheyenne from 1930-1939, during which time he represented the Equitable and Kansas City Life insurance company.

He was affiliated with the Congregational church, AF & AM No. 16, Wheatland, the Wyoming Consistory and the Kalif Shrine.

A daughter, Freda H. Hills survives. Mrs. Hills preceded him in death last July.
