

HOFFMAN, ALBERT EUGENE
April 28, 1884-August 24, 1968

Albert Eugene Hoffman, retired rancher and pioneer resident of Platte County, having resided here since 1894, succumbed Aug. 24, at the Platte County Memorial Hospital after an extended illness. Funeral services were held Tuesday, Aug. 27, from the Wheatland United Methodist Church at 2:00 p.m. with Rev. Henry Hartberg officiating. Interment was in the Wheatland cemetery.

Serving as pallbearers were Own McGill, Pete Tatman, Dick Woodhouse, Sonny Criss, James Irvine, Jr., and Mark Martens.

Mr. Hoffman was born April 28, 1884 in Lancaster County, Neb. and came to Wyoming at the age of 10. He was married to Eoline F. Hudson on Dec. 6, 1909 in Cheyenne. He was affiliated with the Methodist Church.

He was a member of the AF & AM 16, Wyo. Consistory, Korein Shrine, Past Master of the Masonic Lodge and Past Patron of the Order of the Eastern Star.

Mr. Hoffman served as Platte County Commissioner, two terms in the Wyoming House of Representatives, was deputy sheriff at one time, and also served on the Hospital Board. He was Chairman of the County Commissioners when the Platte County Court House was built.

Besides his wife, survivors include two sons, Harold Hoffman of Wheatland and Donald Hoffman of Vicksburg, Miss., and one daughter, Mrs. Marie Grayson, Vicksburg, Miss. Also surviving are two sisters, Mrs. Roy Sherwood, Anaheim, Calif., and Mrs. Orvel Bridgmon, of Wheatland; nine grandchildren and one great grandchild.
