

HOLCOMB, NELLIE DORA BLUNCK

June 12, 1882-August 30, 1951

Nellie Dora Holcomb, born June 12, 1882, near Fort Collins died August 30 in the Wheatland hospital after an extended illness.

Growing up to womanhood in the Fort Collins area, she helped to raise the younger children of the family of six after the death of her mother. In 1903, she became the bride of William T. Holcomb and they moved to the Wheatland Flats in 1905. Mr. Holcomb preceded her in death in 1934.

Mrs. Holcomb was a member of the Banner Rebekah lodge for more than forty years and served as secretary and past noble grand. She was also a member of the Neighbors of Woodcraft.

Survivors include her sister, Mrs. Emma Jewett of Wash., her brother, Ralph Blunck of Dwyer in whose home she had resided for the past four years and a number of nieces and nephews.

Services were held at the Christian church Monday. Burial was in the Wheatland cemetery beside her husband with Mr. C.E. Henry officiating.
