

HOLCOMB, WILLIAM T.
1862-October 4, 1934

William T. Holcomb, one of Wheatland's pioneer settlers, passed away at his home just west of Wheatland, Thursday at about the noon hour. Mr. Holcomb had been in poor health a number of years and of late was confined to his bed. He suffered a great deal in the last years of his life and while his friends knew he could not recover from his illness, his death was a shock to all of them.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Baptist church with the Rev. Chas. F. Thomas officiating. Interment was made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Lyla Watson Funeral Home in charge of arrangements. The Odd Fellow Lodge of which the deceased had been a member for 27 years had charge of the service at the grave. The Rebekah lodge also attended the funeral in a body.

Mr. Holcomb was 71 years, 10 months and 3 days of age at the time of his death. He was born in Madison, Wisc., and came to this section of Wyoming 29 years ago.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Nellie Holcomb, and one sister in Fort Collins, Colo. One son preceded him in death several years ago.
