

HORVATH, ROSE HELEN GOETZ

June 27, 1919-August 16, 1952

People of the Wheatland community was deeply saddened Saturday when they learned of the death of Mrs. Rose Horvath, wife of Steven A. Horvath of Wheatland. Mrs. Horvath had undergone two major operations and failed to recover. She departed this life August 16, 1952, in the Wheatland hospital following a two weeks illness.

Rose Helen Goetz was born in Wheatland, June 27, 1919, to her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Adam Goetz, and died at the age of 33 years. She attended Wheatland schools and was a member of the Evangelical and Reform Church. She and Mr. Horvath were married Feb. 20, 1938 in Reno, Nevada, and made their home in California to 1938 until 1944. They also made their home in Nebraska from 1945 to 1949. She had been a resident of Wheatland for twenty-three years.

She leaves to mourn her husband, Steven; her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Adam Goetz; daughters, Nancy, Stefani and Patricia; two brothers, Fred Goetz of Lyman, Nebr. and Adam Goetz, Jr. of Wheatland; two sisters, Mrs. Mollie Bach of Bakersfield, Calif. and Mrs. Laura Reid of Cameron, Missouri.

Services were held Wednesday afternoon at 2 p.m. in the Evangelical and Reform Church with burial in the Wheatland cemetery.
