

HOWELL, SAMUEL STEPHEN  
February 16, 1894-May 15, 1931

Samuel Stephen Howell, Wheatland resident and World War Veteran, passed away at the National Military Hospital in Leavenworth, Kan., Friday morning, May 15<sup>th</sup>, from heart trouble.

The deceased had been suffering from the effects of the war most of the time since coming home but his condition was thought to have been better until the news of his death was received.

He was born in Macon City, Mo. on February 16<sup>th</sup>, 1894 and came to this section of Wyoming with his parents when a small child. He attended the schools of Wheatland and has made his home here since that time. He went to war from this county and was a member of Company F, 361<sup>st</sup> Infantry, in the 91<sup>st</sup> division. This division left for overseas early in the war and he was gassed in the battle of the Argonne Forest.

His father, Marion Howell, and one sister, Mamie Howell, mourn his passing. His mother died about 4 years ago.

Funeral services were held from the Christian church Tuesday afternoon, with Cecil V. Smith, pastor of that church, officiating. Military services were conducted at the grave by the members of the Ora Call Post No. 10 American Legion. Pallbearers consisted of members of the Ora Call Post. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Lyla Watson Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.
