

JOHNSON, OSCAR J.
May 2, 1888-November 12, 1918

Oscar A. Johnson, son of Mrs. Mary Johnson of Wheatland, died at Miles City, Mont., Nov. 12, at 6 p.m. of pneumonia which followed an attack of influenza.

Mr. Johnson was born on a ranch north of Glendo, May 2, 1888. He was a graduate of Wheatland high school, class of 1907 and the Veterinary department of Ohio State University, class of 1911. He practiced veterinary surgery in Minnesota for about a year, after which he returned west, going to Montana, where the last six years he has been a deputy state veterinarian.

On Aug. 14, 1913, he was married to Miss Louise Adele Linhart, of Columbus, Ohio. He was a member of Wheatland lodge No. 16, A.F. & A.M., Miles City Chapter 14, Miles City; Veritas Council, 6 R & S.M.: Miles City, Miles Commandery & K.T., Miles City; Algeria Temple, A.A.O.U. of the Mystic Shrine, Helene, Mont.; Acucia & Alpha PXI fraternities, of the Ohio State University.

Besides his wife and mother, he leaves to mourn his loss, two sisters, Mrs. E.A. Tisch and Mrs. Frank Wedemeyer of Wheatland, and a brother, J.V. Johnson of Glenrock.

The funeral services were held in Miles City, Nov. 14, and the body was brought to Wheatland where it was buried with Masonic rites. On account of sickness, his wife did not accompany the body to Wheatland.

Mr. Johnson was a young man of sterling quality, and he leaves a large number of friends to mourn his untimely death.
