

KEISTER, HENRY L.

June 29, 1867-October 9, 1899

Monday evening the Angel of Death descended into our midst again, and called the soul of Henry L. Keister to it's grand reward. Mr. Keister was a young man of about 27 years of age and when taken sick about three weeks ago, was employed at the Two Bar ranch. Realizing his condition he came to Wheatland for medical treatment, and at the home of Dr. Clark received every attention possible, but the dread typhoid could not be cheated of its victim, and at 11 o'clock Monday night his soul passed into the great beyond.

The remains were taken in charge by the Modern Woodmen of America, of which lodge Mr. Keister was a member, and on Tuesday afternoon his remains were interred in the Wheatland cemetery with all the honor by that organization. The funeral services were held at the residence of Dr. Clark. Rev. T. Stevenson preaching the sermon.

Mr. Keister came here from Bayard, Nebraska, one year ago last March and during his residence among us had made many friends, who mourn with his relatives at his untimely death.
