

KERSHNER, GUY C.

December 1, 1891-October 6, 1954

Funeral services for Guy C. Kershner, a former resident of the Grayrocks community, were held Monday afternoon at the Schrader chapel, and interment was in the Wheatland cemetery with nephews serving as casket bearers. The Rev. Alan Inglis officiated at the service. Mr. Kershner was born in Bladen, Webster county, Nebraska, December 1, 1891, and died at Tacoma, Wash. as a result of a heart attack October 6.

A farmer, Mr. Kershner and his wife homesteaded here in 1914. Mrs. Kershner died in 1927, and he and his son Vernon continued to make their home here until 1934 when they moved to Washington. For the last several years, Mr. Kershner's heart ailment made it unable for him to work, and he had made his home with his daughter, Mrs. Velma Bures. He was a member of the Baptist church.

He leaves, in addition to his son and daughter, both of Tacoma, Wash., eight grandchildren, six great grandchildren and three sisters, Miss Pearl Kershner of Tacoma, Mrs. Merl Douglas of Seattle, and Mrs. Don Barton of Wheatland.
