

KINCAID, AMANDA TIPTON
September 14, 1854-December 11, 1920

Mrs. Amanda Maude Kincaid, wife of A.S. Kincaid, died at her late home west of Wheatland on Friday, Dec. 10, 1920, after suffering for several years from asthma. She was born in Northfield, Indiana, Sept. 14, 1856. On Nov. 12, 1872, she was united in marriage to S.A. Kincaid, the husband who survives her. To them were born three children, all of whom preceded the mother into eternity. One foster son, two years of age, is left with the bereaved husband. For 20 years, Mr. and Mrs. Kincaid lived at South Haven, Kansas, coming to Wheatland two years ago in hope the change in climate might be beneficial to her health. Funeral services were conducted Sunday by Rev. C.M. Wales, pastor of Christian church, of which organization Mrs. Kincaid had been a devoted member for 45 years. Besides the husband and child, she leaves four brothers- Judge Tipton of Trinidad, Colo.; W.H. Tipton of Vetersburg, Ind.; G.W. Tipton of South Dakota and T.H. Tipton of Rishill, Mo.
