

KLASSERT, HENRY
June 10, 1849-December 6, 1915

People were grieved to learn of the death, on Monday night, of Henry Klassert, one of our substantial farmers and a pioneer of the colony. Death resulted from a large carbuncle on his neck, from which he had been suffering for three weeks. He was ill for a week or more before being brought to the hospital. Upon his arrival, Dr. Phifer announced his condition as dangerous. On Saturday he began to fail, the poison taking hold on his system. Monday afternoon it was seen that there was practically no hope for him and his family were summoned and with him at the time of his death. His age and condition were such that operating could not safely be done, and it was not attempted, but every effort was made to relieve his suffering.

Funeral services will be held on Thursday at the Catholic church of this city.
