

KOONS, VIOLA MAY MOIR
1870-1924

Mrs. Viola May Koons of Laramie, and formerly a resident for many years at Owens, died Sunday while receiving hospital attention here for cancer, and was buried Tuesday afternoon from the Shierry Mortuary, Mrs. E.L. Butler conducting the ceremony.

Viola May Moir was born in Omaha in 1870, being 53 years, 3 months and 16 days of age at the time of her death. At the age of 2 years, she came with her parents to Laramie, Wyoming where she grew to young womanhood, attending city schools and the University of Wyoming. She was married in October 1893 to J.F. Koons of Iowa. For many years she was a resident on a ranch 35 miles west of Wheatland. Her old daughter, Frances Koons, died during the flu epidemic a few years ago, shortly after her marriage to J.E. Yarbrough.

She is survived by her husband, two sons, Dan and Dillon Koons; by four daughters, Mrs. Dora Bartlett of Laramie, and Iris, Marguerite and Jessie who are students in the Laramie schools; by her mother, Mrs. Mary D. Moir of Laramie; and by three brothers, Frank Moir of Pueblo, J.W. Moir of Denver and C.D. Moir of Laramie.

She was buried in the Wheatland cemetery beside her daughter.
