

Charles William Krewer

April 10, 1916 – December 12, 2008

A memorial service for Charles William "Charlie" Krewer, 92, was conducted at 2:00 P.M., Thursday, December 18, 2008, at Gorman Funeral Homes – Platte Chapel in Wheatland, Wyoming, with Pastor Marlin Driskell officiating. Inurnment with military rites accorded by the Laramie Peak Veterans of Foreign Wars Post #3558 and Ora Call American Legion Post #10 was in the Wheatland Cemetery.

He died Friday, December 12, 2008, at the Life Care Center of Cheyenne in Cheyenne, Wyoming.

Charles was born April 10, 1916, in Dalton, Nebraska, the son of Henry W. and EuNora (Bancroft) Krewer. When he was a young child his parents moved to the Dwyer Community and then to Wheatland where he was reared and educated, graduating from Wheatland High School. He served in the United States Army

and worked for Blow Oil Company and Hopkins Construction as a bookkeeper. Charlie married Lillian Fern (Isabell) Edmiston. In 1966, they moved to Cheyenne where he began working for the Wyoming Highway Department, retiring after 20 years of service. He enjoyed gardening, coin collecting, music, and fishing.

Survivors include his daughter, Lynn Rogers and a grandson, Allan Rogers both of Cheyenne.

He was preceded in death by his parents; his wife, Lillian on March 26, 2007; and three siblings, Myrtle Higgins, Ruth Krewer, and Albert Krewer.
