

# Mae Meredith Kuehner

December 7, 1919 - September 22, 2010 *Record Times*

Funeral services for Mae Meredith Kuehner, 90, were held at 2:00 p.m., Monday, September 27, 2010, at First Christian Church in Wheatland, Wyoming with Pastor Andy Gudahl officiating. Interment with military rites conducted by American Legion Post #10 and Laramie Peak Post #3558 Veterans of Foreign Wars was in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Mrs. Kuehner died Wednesday, September 22, 2010, at Porter Adventist Hospital in Denver, Colorado.

Meredith was born December 7, 1919, in Kimmell, Indiana, the daughter of Louis Merle and Lena Marie (Smith) Wolf. She moved as a child to Mishawaka, Indiana and graduated from Mishawaka High School in 1937. She worked as a hairdresser during high school. Later as a young woman she worked in the accounting department of Standard Oil of Indiana. During World War II she was a Navy Wave, serving as a Radioman Third Class in Communications at the headquarters of the Eighth Naval District in New Orleans, Louisiana. She knew Morse code.

Meredith married Roy C. Kuehner on December

18, 1944, in New Orleans. After her discharge from the Navy she returned to civilian life as a housewife and mother. She did occasional temporary work as a typist. Her retirement years were in Wheatland since 1978. She enjoyed dancing to the big bands, line dancing, sewing, swimming and playing the piano. She was a member of First Christian Church.

She is survived by two sons, Jeffrey Roy Kuehner of Colorado Springs, Colorado and Russell Merle Kuehner of Wheatland and numerous nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her parents; husband on February 16, 2000; a brother, Lale Wolf; and a sister, Marilyn Vande Putte.
