Bessie Munro Lindeman, age 88, passed away Saturday Feb. 3, 1979 at the Platte County Memorial Hospital Nursing Wing in Wheatland.

She was born Aug. 5, 1890 in Kearney, Nebraska. She was raised in Milford and Columbus, Nebraska and Grand Junction, Colo. She attended the University of Washington in Seattle, Wash.

She married Herman H. Lindeman in Grand Junction, Colo. on Sept. 12, 1912 in her father's church. Her husband was a minister in Congregational (later United Church of Christ) churches and she served with him in churches in Montana, Nebraska, Iowa, South Dakota, Oklahoma, Colorado, and Wyoming.

After her devotion to her family and church, came her interest in P.E.O. She became a member of this organization in Grand Junction, Colo. before her marriage and was an active member in seven Chapters in six different states, helping to start one Chapter and holding offices, including that of president, in many others.

She had a life-long love of poetry, which, along with a unique memory, gave her a great resource of poems which she used generously in programs for friends and organizations.

Funeral services were conducted Monday, Feb. 5, 1979 at 2:00 at the United Church of Christ in Wheatland with Rev. Gordon Grant officiating. Burial was in the Wheatland Cemetery.
