

Brief Illness Claims

Life Of Harry Linton

A brief illness ¹⁻¹³⁻¹⁹⁷² claimed the life of Harry G. Linton on Thursday, January 13, 1972 at The Platte County Memorial Hospital. He was 84 years of age.

Born in Centralia, Illinois on June 24, 1887, he moved to Wheatland in 1906. Mr. Linton was well known to Wheatland residents and was active in civic projects. He took over the Wheatland Men's Baseball Team in the late 1940's and was in charge of the team for several years. Retired, he was a bartender by profession and worked locally for many years.

In 1915 he was joined in marriage with Hattie Petty on Jan. 1. Five children were born to this union, four sons, and one daughter.

He is survived by his wife, Hattie of Wheatland; two sons, Billy of Longmont, Colo., and Raymond of Biloxi, Miss.; one daughter, Mrs. Cora Bowman of Casper; two sisters, Mrs. Ethel Halperin and Mrs. Wilma Landauer, both of Hollywood, Fla.; four grandchildren and four great grandchildren. Two sons, George and Everett, preceded him in death.

Funeral services were held Tuesday, January 18, 1972 at 2:00 p.m. at the Schrader Chapel with Rev. Henry Hartberg conducting the service. Burial was in the Wheatland Cemetery. Pallbearers included Frank Robinson, Cleve Artery, Kohn Artery, Keith Artery, Bryce Orr and Don Borthwick.
