

LOOMIS, FRED WILLARD
October 14, 1881-November 2, 1955

Fred Willard Loomis, well-known Wheatland resident, passed away at a local hospital shortly before midnight Wednesday, November 2, following an extended illness. Born in Iona, Kans., October 14, 1881, where he spent his early life, the deceased was a retired rancher and had resided in Wheatland the past 25 years. He had lived in Platte county since 1919, and was foreman on the Ben Turpin ranch on Cottonwood for 11 years.
