Raymond J. Lutterman passed away November 24th, 2016 at the New Horizon Care Center in Lovell, Wyoming. He was born on August 24, 1930 in Blackwell, WI. The son of Emery and Minnie (Schmidt) Lutterman. Ray was raised and educated in Wisconsin. He graduated in 1948.

He received a football scholarship from the University of Wyoming. He played football for U.W. 1950-51-54-55. During this time, he was all conference captain of the team (tackle). He played in the Sun Bowl and the Gator Bowl during this time. Ray married Bonnie Jean Loomis August 6, 1955. He graduated from the

University of Wyoming, May 26, 1956 with- honors. Ray then went into the Service. He served in Fort Ord, CA and Korea as a Supply clerk. During the time in Fort Ord he played football with the Fort Ord Warriors.

While he was serving his country, his first child Scott was born in Wheatland. He returned to Laramie and joined the ROTC and received his commission as a 2nd Lieutenant and went to Fort Benning Georgia (1957). In August 1957 Ray and Bonnie and family moved to Casper Wyoming where he coached football, wrestling and track. During this time his first daughter Lisa was born in Wheatland. In 1961 they moved to the Loomis ranch and resided there. In 1962 another daughter Lori was born. Then in 1965 Ray went back to Laramie where he received his Master's degree in Physical Education. While in Laramie they had their 4th child Heidi which made their family complete. Ray and his family then moved to Powell Wyoming where he was the Recreation Director for 6 years then later became General Commissioner and was there for 17 years. Ray and Bonnie moved to Oregon and Washington, then back to Wyoming where he always considered to be his home.
