Harris Maiz, who was seriously burned one night last week when his clothing caught fire at his camp near Wendover, and who succumbed to his injuries several days later after being brought to Wheatland for treatment, was buried in the Wheatland cemetery on Tuesday. Burial services were held at the grave by Rev. Cecil Smith. Funeral arrangements were in charge of the Longwith-Richards Funeral Home.

Maiz had been traveling over the country looking for work and had built a camp fire near the water tank at Wendover, his clothing catching fire from the flames during the night. He was badly burned about the body when he was awakened from his sleep, and made his way to the Wendover station for assistance. His lower limbs were burned so badly that flesh dropped from his body.

Maiz was a Mexican and his relatives are reported to live at Grand Junction, Colo.
