

MARTINSON, LYDIA ERNESTINE DRUBE

November 16, 1899-July 9, 1951

Lydia Drube Martinson, 51, who made her home in Wheatland from 1911 to August, 1924 succumbed Monday, July 9 at Brining hospital in Dayton, Wash. following an illness of several months.

The remains will arrive in Wheatland Monday morning, and services will be held at Schrader Chapel Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock with Rev. Howard Rice officiating.

Born November 16, 1899 at Madison, Minn., she came to Wheatland with her parents in 1911. She attended school here and in June, 1924 graduated from the Wheatland General hospital training school for nurses. She followed the profession of nursing and for the past 15 years, had been manager and supervisor at the Brining hospital in Dayton.

Surviving are six sisters, Mrs. Hugo Lange, Mrs. John Merbach and Mrs. Augusta Swan of Wheatland, Mrs. William Rounds of Kelowna, B.C., Canada, Mrs. Rose Komis and Mrs. Carrie Ryff of Missoula, Mont.; and two brothers, Fritz Drube of Wheatland and Ernest Drube of Russell, Kans. Her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Fritz Drube and one brother preceded her in death.
