

MCCARTY, STELLA MAY THOMPSON

September 25, 1865-May 11, 1937

Funeral services for Mrs. W.T. McCarty, who died Tuesday night at Wheatland, will be conducted from the chapel of the Copley Funeral Home tomorrow (Friday) afternoon at two o'clock. Rev Pipkin will have charge of the services and interment will be made in the Wheatland cemetery.

Mrs. McCarty was a pioneer resident of the Slater community, she and her husband having homesteaded there about twenty years ago. Mr. McCarty preceded his wife in death about a year ago.

Stella May Thompson was born on September 25, 1865 at Wolf Creek, Monroe County, West Virginia.

In 1883, she was united in marriage to W.T. McCarty at Wolf Creek, West Virginia, coming to Wyoming in 1916 where they homesteaded, living on their farm until the passing of Mr. McCarty in June, 1936.

To this union nine children were born, three dying in infancy. The surviving children are: Carl of Cheyenne; Clarence of North Platte, Nebr.; Frank of Wheatland; Mrs. Ollie Schmidt of Burlington, Iowa; Mrs. Ethyl Ekstrom of Slater; and Mrs. Louise Babcock of Casper. Also surviving are four brothers, John and William Thompson of Wykonda, Missouri; Neil Thompson of Plymouth, W. Va.; and George Thompson of Hot Springs, Arkansas. There are 22 grandchildren and 13 great grandchildren surviving.

Rev. Pipkin of the Baptist church had charge of the services at the Copley Funeral Home. Pallbearers were Ed Smith, Ed Zeman, Charles Campbell, Brice McElvain, Ralph Baker and Earl Harvey. Interment was made in the Wheatland cemetery.
