OBITUARY

Corydon Baxter McClelland was born of religious parents November 18th, 1837 in Mercer county, Pa. Was married May 24th, 1853 to Jane M. McCartney. Five children were born to this union, of whom one son, Herbert I. and one daughter, Hattie J. are waiting on the other shore to welcome father home.

He is survived by his aged wife, one son, Robert A., of Goldfield, Nevada, and two daughters, Mrs. A.N. Cook, of Vermillion, S.D., and Mrs. Albert Cobb, of Wheatland, Wyo. Two sisters and two brothers also survive him, living in the east.

He was converted in early life and has always been an earnest and enthusiastic worker in the church and Sunday school, being Sunday school superintendent for over twenty years, 17 years of this time in the Methodist Sunday school at College Springs, Iowa.

He moved to Wyoming in the spring of 1908 and has since made this his home. He died April 27th, 1911, aged 73 years, five months and nine days.

The funeral services were conducted by his pastor, Rev. J.K. Hicks, from the M.E. church of Wheatland, and his body laid to rest in the Wheatland cemetery.

Thus another good man has gone to his reward. Certainly brother McClelland was one of the faithful ones. During all last winter and up to the time of his death, he was one of the faithful workers for the Sunday school at church services at Uva, and the little band of workers at that place will miss Father McClelland's helpful presence in the coming days.

The relatives and friends have the heartfelt sympathy of all, and especially do we sympathize and pray for the aged wife and companion, that must travel life's road alone until the Saviour calls her home to that land where we will never say goodbye.
