

MCDERMID, MALCOLM

1876-June 4, 1902

The death of Malcolm McDermid occurred Wednesday evening at 10:15 o'clock at the LD ranch at Bordeaux, his death being very sudden and entirely unexpected.

Mr. McDermid was taken sick on Wednesday of last week at the home of his sister, Mrs. John McDougall, and as he did not improve, an effort was made to bring the young man to Wheatland, but as his condition became more serious it was impossible and he was cared for at the LD ranch. His sickness was pronounced typhoid fever, but it was complicated by a serious chronic heart trouble with which the deceased had been afflicted for a number of years. His condition was not believed dangerous at all, but Wednesday evening the heart trouble became more pronounced and death followed in a few minutes, the end coming peacefully and almost before those at his bedside could realize what had transpired.

The deceased came here from Burgoyne, Ontario, Canada, and for a year past had been in the employ of the Swan Land & Cattle company. He was a bright, congenial and upright young man, and was a general favorite with his associates and friends. His death was a great shock and is sincerely mourned by all who knew him.

Interment was made yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock in the Wheatland cemetery, and brief services were conducted at the grave by Rev. Crater.
