

FUNERAL FOR ALEX MC DOUGAL BEING HELD HERE TODAY

Platte Co. Pioneer Died
At Granger, Wyo.
Monday

With the death of Alexander McDougall, another of Platte county's well known pioneers passed away. Mr. McDougall's death occurred at Granger of this state, where he was making headquarters while in the employ of the state in the Highway department. Funeral services will be held this afternoon, Thursday, at 2 o'clock in the Congregational church. The Wheatland Masonic Lodge of which he was a member, is in charge of the services. Burial is being made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Wheatland Mortuary in charge of arrangements.

Alexander McDougall was born in Port Edin, Canada, September 12th 1865 and was 63 years of age at the time of his death. In 1892 he came to Wyoming and settled on the M— ranch in the Slater neighborhood. In 1904 he moved to the 2— ranch in the Kuyuls district, where he lived until moving to the McDougal ranch on Sand Creek, which is southwest of Wheatland. For the past two years he has been employed by the state in the highway department and has been working in the Rock Springs country. He was a member of Wheatland Lodge No. 16 F. and A. M., and a member of the Wyoming consistory No. 1 of Cheyenne. He is survived by his mother, Mrs. Ann McDougal of Wheatland, his wife, one daughter, Mrs. Otto Rouse of Wheatland, two sons, Donald, who at the present time is working in Lusk and John, who has been working in Laramie. His mother, Mrs. Ann McDougall has been in very poor health for some time and has been living at the McDougal home here and Mrs. Otto Rouse has been living in town this winter so that she might be able to help her mother and grandmother.
