

MCDUGALL, ANNA MACDOUGALL

November 12, 1844-July 11, 1929

Mrs. Anna McDougall, a resident of the Wheatland community and Wyoming for the past 39 years, passed away in her home in Wheatland Thursday, July 11th, after suffering as an invalid for a period of 12 years.

Mrs. McDougall was born in Kilbride, Scotland November 12, 1844. In 1858, she was united in marriage to Donald McDougall. To this union, one child, Alexander McDougall, was born and who preceded his mother in death in January of this year. Shortly after her marriage, they moved to Burgoyne, Ont., Canada where they resided until they came to Wyoming in 1890. They lived in Chugwater until 1907, when they moved to the Two-Bar ranch on the Sybille, which was their home for 8 years. They then moved to their own ranch on Sand creek, where they resided until about five years ago. Since the death of her husband in 1890, she has resided with her son and family. She was a member of the Presbyterian church in Burgoyne, Can. She is survived by two brothers, Colin MacDougall of Wheatland and John MacDougall of Owen Sound, Can. One sister, Mrs. Mary McArthur of Burgoyne, 2 grandsons, John McDougall of Laramie and Donald McDougall of Hot Springs, S.D., one granddaughter, Mrs. Otto Rouse of Wheatland and two great grandchildren, Robert and Donald Rouse of Wheatland.

Funeral services were held from the Congregational church, Sunday afternoon with Rev. Robert Hoffman of that church officiating and burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Watson Mortuary in charge of arrangements.
