David McFarlane, Old Settler, Heeds His Maker's Call

The many friends and relatives of David McFarlane, Platte County pioneer, were grieved to learn of his death, Wednesday morning, January fourth. Mr. McFarlane was evidently feeling well the day before, and his sudden death was a shock to everyone.

Mr. McFarlane was born in Scotland in 1851 and came to this country with his parents when four years of age. He came to Wyoming in 1871, working on the M bar ranch where the post office in Slater is now located. He left the M bar ranch and moved to Cheyenne and in a few years, returned to the Wheatland district, and took up a ranch near the Owen post office where he lived until his death. Mr. McFarlane made his home in Wheatland during the winter months for the past few years, and came to his home here Oct. 7th to spend the winter here as usual. He leaves a wife, Mrs. Agnes McFarlane, a daughter, a daughter, Mrs. George Brandle of Garrett; two sisters, Mrs. David Cochrane of Wheatland and Mrs. Dan McUlvane of Cheyenne to mourn his death.

The funeral will be held from the Congregational church, Friday afternoon, January 6th at 2:00, conducted by Rev. D. Powell. The arrangements are in charge of the Watson Mortuary.

Mr. McFarlane was one of the well known and respected men of this community, and coming here in the early days helped to build this country. The Times and his many friends wish to extend their sympathy to his wife and family in their loss.
