

MCGILL, THOMAS ALLEN
February 20, 1877-June 2, 1966

Thomas Allen McGill, a retired rancher, succumbed at the age 89, in the Platte County Memorial Hospital on June 2, 1966, where he had been confined since March 23. Mr. McGill, a native son of Wyoming, was born at Tie Siding Feb. 20, 1877, and at the age of one, moved to the Kite ranch where he resided until 1908, when he purchased the present Owen McGill ranch.

He attended Rock Creek school and married Nora Dodge at the Kite ranch in 1906. She preceded him in death 27 years ago. Mr. McGill operated a ranch at Centennial, Wyo. in connection with his other ranch operations. He retired and moved to Wheatland in 1948.

The deceased was a member of AF & AM No. 3, Wyoming Consistory No. 1, Knights Templar Korein Shrine, Wyoming Stock Growers Assn, Laramie Peak Stock Growers Assn. and was a former member of the executive board of the Wyoming Stock Growers Assn. and a member of the Wyoming Historical Society.

Surviving relatives include his daughters, Mrs. Mary Johnston and Mrs. Agnes Turney and son, Owen McGill, all of Wheatland; sister, Mrs. Margaret Irvine, and a half-brother, John McGill, both of Laramie; step-brother, James Settle, Fairplay, Colo.; half-sister, Mrs. Frances Parks, China Lake, Calif.; four granddaughters and three great grandchildren.

Last rites were conducted by Dr. Arthur A. Miller of Denver at the Methodist church in Wheatland, on June 6, at 2:00 p.m. Dr. Miller was assisted by Rev. Theodore Foster.

Pallbearers included Bob Russell, Don Sherard, Dick Woodhouse, William Boyd, Jack Nixon, and Robert Howe. Masonic services were held at the graveside in the Wheatland cemetery.
