

MCGINTY, MARY ROSE WILDE
1886-September 22, 1922

Mrs. A.J. McGinty, formerly Mary Rose Wilde of this city, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Wilde, died at St. Luke's hospital at Denver Friday, Sept. 22, following an operation for removal of gall stones, from which she had been a sufferer for twelve years. The funeral was held from the Catholic church here Monday, at 10:00 o'clock, interment taking place in the Wilde family plot at the Wheatland cemetery, where the parents lie. Mass was said by Father Adolph of Douglas. The funeral was one of the most largely attended that has been held in the city for some time, and was characterized by the profusion and beauty of the floral tributes from the friends of the family.

Mrs. McGinty was born in Boulder, Colo., but was brought to this community by her parents when a small child and received her education here. She leaves a husband and two sons, Clifford, aged 15 and Edward, 13. She was a sister of Mrs. H.W. Meglemre and William Wilde of this city, and of Mrs. E.M. Edwards of Chehalis, Wash. The latter was unable to be at the funeral owing to illness in the family. Other near relatives of the family who were present at the funeral were Mr. and Mrs. W.J. McGinty of Denver, parents of the husband; Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Wilde and Mrs. Kate Frevert of Lingle.

Mrs. McGinty is remembered here as a girl and woman of unusual qualities that aroused sincere regard, and was later known as a homemaker, wife and mother of irreproachable character and faithfulness to her ideals. The sincerest expressions of sympathy have been general.

The body arrived Sunday night and lay in state at the McCallum-Shierry Mortuary until the hour of the funeral. It was visited by numerous friends who heaped the bier with flowers.
