Samuel Dean McGuire died Monday, Oct. 17, 1994 in a one-vehicle accident on Highway 34 in Platte County.

He was born March 1, 1978, in Cheyenne, Wyo., the son of Daniel L. and Loretta (Mathias) McGuire. He was reared on the McGuire Ranch and educated in the Wheatland Schools. At the time of his death, he was a junior at Wheatland High School. Sam was active in high school rodeo as a team roper, on the football team and on the WHS wrestling squad.

He loved horses, cattle and the ranch way of life. He was a member of the Platte County Horseman's Association, Saint Patrick's Catholic Church and the Catholic Youth Organization.

He was recently chosen as one of four students to represent Wheatland High School at an AIDS seminar to be held in Story, Wyo.

Sam is survived by his parents, Dan of Wheatland, and Loretta McGuire of Sheridan, Wyo., three brothers, Shawn and wife, Shelly, of Torrington, Shane, of Clearfield, S.D., Steven of Wheatland, and a sister, Shannon McGuire, of Sheridan.
