A service for Christian Burial for Tyler Britt McManus, 13, was held Wednesday, Jan. 25, 1995, at 11 a.m. at the First Christian Church in Wheatland, with Father Richard Kalber of St. George's Episcopal Church of Lusk, Wyo., officiating, and Dr. George Faris as Eulogist. Interment followed in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Tyler died Saturday, Jan. 21, 1995, at the United Medical Center West in Cheyenne, following a brief illness.

He was born Dec. 8, 1981, in Wheatland, the son of Robert David and Callae Jo (Curless) McManus. He was attending Wheatland Junior High School as a seventh grader at the time of his death. Tyler was active in football and choir at school.

He loved the outdoors, riding horses, playing street hockey, hunting and fishing. He was active in the family cow-calf operation. Tyler was a member of All Saints Episcopal Church where he served as altar boy, a member of the Sybille 4-H Livestock Club, and Sharpshooters 4-H Club where he was just elected president.

He was a Chicago Bulls and Denver Broncos fan. He is survived by his parents, a brother, Rory McManus, paternal grandparents, Melvin and Rosemarie Roby, all of Wheatland, and his maternal grandparents, Jack and Emma Jean Curless of Pine Bluffs, Wyo.

Also surviving are his aunts and uncles, Tim Curless of Cheyenne, Cheri and Louie Santini of Cheyenne, John Curless of Pine Bluffs, Bill and Linda McManus of Dickinson, N.D., Mike and Martie Bland of East Longmeadow, Mass., and Jo Hoffman of Coral Springs, Fla., and numerous other aunts, uncles and cousins.

He was preceded in death by his paternal grandfather, William E. McManus.
