Services for Earl Adam Miller, 93, who died in Wheatland May 12, 1987, were held Friday, May 15, 1987 at 10:30 a.m. in the Schrader-Prell Funeral Home Chapel with Pastor Virgil Lamm officiating.

Earl Miller was born in Kirksville, Mo., Feb. 27, 1894, the son of John and Mary (Mauch) Miller. He was raised on the family farm and after completing his education continued farming with his father.

On November 30, 1920 he married Mary Staffer in Gering, Neb. When he was 26 he entered the U.S. Army and suffered an injury to his hip while serving in France. After being discharged from military service he attended mechanical school in Fort Collins, Colo., and upon graduating worked as a mechanic for a short time there.

He and his wife later moved to Wheatland and operated the Mountain View Camp for a number of years. After his retirement the couple built their home where they spent their retirement years. Mary died in June of 1982 and Earl continued to be active with his garden and yard work up until the time of his death. He also enjoyed hunting and fishing.

He is survived by a son, Wendell Miller of Denver; a daughter, Winona Spencer of Montrose, Colo.; three nieces, a grandchild and a great grandchild.

Besides his wife, he was preceded in death by a brother, Pearl, and three sisters: May, Cora, and Sara.

A memorial in his name has been established to the Platte Co. Senior Citizens.

Burial was in the Wheatland Cemetery.
