Freda Miller, 77, of Dwyer, died Nov. 14 at St. Joseph's Hospital in Denver,

Colo.

She was born in Bloomfield, Neb., on July 16, 1901, and married Julius William Miller in Dakota City, Neb., on July 22, 1926.

They moved to Sunrise in 1926 and in 1927 started their own farming operation.
