

MILLER, MINNIE LEE RAGSDALE

May 7, 1882-May 14, 1945

Mrs. Lou T. Miller, 63, passed away at her home 3 ½ miles southwest of Wheatland early Monday morning as a result of cerebral hemorrhage. Mrs. Miller had suffered a stroke of paralysis about two years ago from which she had only partially recovered.

Minnie Lee Miller was born in Seymour, Mo. on May 7, 1882 to Mr. and Mrs. Jack Ragsdale. On February 14, 1912, she was united in marriage to Lou T. Miller, and to this union eight children were born, four of whom preceded her in death. In 1927 the family moved to Nebraska where they made their home for nine years, then coming to Wyoming, they settled in the community south of Wheatland where they had since made their home.

Besides her husband, she is survived by a son and daughter by a former marriage, Harry Hammonds of Eaton, Colo. and Mrs. Mabel Graves of Willow Springs, Mo.; two sons, Emmons of Wheatland and Oscar of the U.S. army in the Pacific; two daughters, Mrs. Rebecca Johnson of Pierce, Colo. and Alma of Wheatland; two step-children, Floyd of Wheatland and Mrs. Niccic Hensley of Eaton; two brothers, John Ragsdale of Springfield, Mo. and Jess Ragsdale of Medored, Ore.; and a sister, Mrs. E.R. Davis of Medored, Ore.; 11 grandchildren, 2 step grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Wednesday at 2 p.m. in the Baptist church with the Rev. Charles F. Thomas officiating. Burial was in the Wheatland cemetery. Pallbearers included Floyd Howard, Ray Howard, Lon Miller, Earl Miller, R.E. Dunn and John Peters.
