

Ruth Bosworth Miller

Funeral services for Ruth Bosworth Miller, 96, were held Tuesday, Nov. 22, 1994, at 1 p.m. at the First Christian Church in Wheatland, with Andy Gudahl, Minister, officiating.

Mrs. Miller died Thursday, Nov. 17, 1994 at her Wheatland home.

She was born Oct. 5, 1898, in Summerville, Mass., the daughter of George S. and Grace Blanch (Bosworth) Martin. Ruth and her father moved to Wyoming and settled at Iron Mountain in 1900. She married Charles A. Miller on Dec. 1, 1920, in Cheyenne.

They homesteaded and ranched what came to be known as Miller Ranch in Albany, Laramie and Platte counties, from 1920-1958, at which time they moved to Wheatland.

Ruth was actively involved in CowBelles, Daughters of the Nile, Eastern Star, Garden Club, and was a hospital volunteer. She was instrumental in founding several of the state and local organizations, and held various offices throughout the years.

She was still actively participating in the Daughters of the Nile and Card Marathon at the time of her death.

Ruth is survived by two grandchildren and their spouses, Howard Lee and Judy Miller of Wheatland, and Cheri and Ray Wardell of Moorcroft, Wyo. Two great-grandchildren, Marti Lee Yost and Brandin Miller, both of Wheatland, and two great-great-granddaughters, Bailey Yost and Darbi Yost, both of Wheatland, also survive.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, Charles A. (Gus) Miller, one son, Howard E. (Mick) Miller and an infant brother.
