

MITCHELL, CHARLES ANDREW

March 11, 1916-May 31, 1965

Charles Andrew Mitchell, a Wheatland resident for the past two years was killed when the 1961 Ford Station Wagon he was driving struck a bridge abutment on an unfinished section of Interstate 25 ten miles north of Wheatland on May 31. Mitchell, a chef at White's Vimbo's, had resided in Casper prior to moving to Wheatland. He was a veteran of World War II receiving his discharge in August 1945 from the 507 Parachute Inf. Regiment. He was also a member of the American Legion and the VFW. The deceased was born in Salmon, Ida. March 11, 1916.

Graveside services were conducted by Rev. Clifford Polson at the Wheatland cemetery on June 2, 1965 at 11:00 a.m. with Kohn Artery, Cleve Artery, Jack White, Vernon Short, Louie Vigil and Vic White serving as pallbearers.

Survivors include his wife Avis and daughter, Mae Moreen, age 3, who were with him at the time of the accident. Both are hospitalized. He is also survived by a sister, Mrs. Buell Scherek of Laramie.
