Funeral services for Gladys Temperance Mitchell, 83, who died in Douglas Monday, Oct. 19, 1987, will be held in the Latter Day Saints Church in Wheatland at 2:30 p.m. today with LeGrande Page, Elder.

Born March 22, 1904 in Jewell County, Kan., Gladys Mitchell was the daughter of David and Leah (Gist) Patton. She moved with her family to the Cottonwood area in 1918. She graduated from Wheatland High School in 1922. In 1924 she and George Mitchell were married and the couple

returned to ranch on his family homestead which is still being operated by her family.

She was past-Wyoming Democratic State Committee Woman and served as delegate to the Electoral College for the Democratic Party. She was a charter member of the Laramie Peak Stock Growers Association, past president of the Laramie Peak Cowbelles, and served on the National Beef Council.

Survivors include her son Robert Mitchell and her daughter Barbara Roff, both of Wheatland, two brothers: Shell and Claude Patton; four sisters: Helen Patton, Ruth Walcher, Winnie Emerson, Polly Bradshaw; five grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

Besides her parents she was preceded in death by her husband in 1980, by two brothers and one grandson, Miles Mitchell.
