

MOJDEN, AUGUSTA C. LARSON  
December 31, 1854-March 4, 1932

Mrs. August Mojden, who had been confined to her bed in a Cheyenne hospital for the last six weeks, suffering from a broken hip, passed away Friday, March 4.

The deceased was born in Sweden, December 31, 1854, and came to the United States about 50 years ago. In 1910, she and her family moved from Chicago to the Dwyer vicinity where they settled on a homestead and lived there ever since.

She is survived by her husband, her son, Wallace A. Mojden of Chicago, who works for Armour & Co., as an accountant, one daughter, Grace Mojden of Dwyer.

Funeral services were held from the Wheatland Baptist church Monday afternoon. Dr. J.T. Hanna and Mr. Farrar, both former friends and pastors of the deceased, conducted the services. Music was furnished by Mesdames M.N. Hanna, R.E. Duffy, O.G. Thompson and H.T. Rutherford and the pallbearers were also Dwyer friends, and included A.D. Russell, H.T. Rutherford, Clarence Snakenberg, Will Call, George Ballard and Ralph Blunck.

Interment took place in the Wheatland cemetery with the Copley Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.
