

MONGER, MARY ELEANOR HOBBS

May 8, 1892-November 25, 1925

Mary Eleanor Monger, oldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Hobbs of the ranch country west of Wheatland and a teacher in the Platte County schools for several years, died here Wednesday, November 25, having been brot here several weeks ago from her home in Salt Lake.

Mrs. Monger was born at Greeley, Colo. May 8, 1892, and moved with her parents to the present Hobbs ranch on the Laramie River 18 miles west of Wheatland in 1900. She attended the Wheatland high school in 1912, teaching three years. She was married to Daniel Monger in 1915, and they resided for seven years on a farm near Greyrocks. Three years ago they moved to Levoe, where the family resided until the serious illness of the mother necessitated her removal here.

She joined the Wheatland Christian Church in girlhood and was a very active Sunday school and church worker in all the communities in which she lived. In addition to her husband, she leaves two children, Alice, seven years old, and Robert, nine years old.

Her long residence here and her lovable personality gave her very many friends here, with whom the Times joins in extending sympathy to her family.
