

MOODY, WILLIAM ROBY
May 17, 1864-June 12, 1926

William Roby Moody, a farmer and an active citizen of the Wheatland Flats for a period of 15 years, died Saturday at his house in Bushnell, Nebr. after a month's illness and was buried in the Wheatland cemetery Tuesday afternoon.

Moody was born at Cove Creek, N.C., May 17, 1864. He was married there at the age of 29 years to Miss Daisy Long. They continued to make their home in North Carolina for a number of years where Cora, Vivian, Wrex and Emerson Moody were born. The family moved here in 1907, settling on a farm on the Wheatland Flats southeast of town. Here they lived for 15 years, and here, the younger children, Dean and William were born.

Wrex was killed here in a horseback accident in 1917 and was buried in the Wheatland cemetery.

In 1922, the family left for Pine Bluffs and thence moved to Bushnell, Nebr. Where Mr. Moody had been associated with his son, Emerson Moody, in farming for the past three years. He had been in poor health for several years, but was believed to be improved during the past spring. About a month ago, he was taken severely ill with intestinal flu with typhoid symptoms, and gradually grew worse.

The family arrived here Tuesday morning, including Mrs. Cora Moody Ray of Pine Bluffs, and Mrs. Vivian Moody Britton of Trenton, Nebr. The funeral was held Tuesday afternoon from the Watson undertaking parlors and he was buried beside his son in the Wheatland cemetery.

He leaves many good friends here to regret his passing.
