

MOODY, WREX R.
1900-March 5, 1917

The whole community was inexpressibly shocked and grieved to learn of the death of Rex Moody, the sixteen year old son of Mr. and Mrs. W.L. Moody, which occurred early Tuesday morning.

The young man left the house a little after noon to search for a lost cow. He was using the same saddle horse which his younger brother had been riding a week previous when he came so near to sustaining fatal injuries. Some time later the horse was seen running loose near the house. A search was at once made for the missing boy, and he was found in a neighboring field, badly bruised, unconscious, and all but frozen.

He was at once removed to the house, Dr. F.G. Huffman was summoned, and everything possible was done for the lad, but without avail, death coming early the next morning without even a partial return to consciousness.

Two sisters of the young man, Miss Cora Moody, who is attending school in Denver, and Mrs. Hugh Ray of Pinebluffs, were summoned by wire and were with him when the end came.

The funeral services were held on Wednesday afternoon at two o'clock from the Congregational church, Rev. W. L. Wade officiating, and was one of the largest ever held in Wheatland, the students of the high school and the boys band attending in a body.
