

MOON, JOHN CLARENCE
September 22, 1882-July 15, 1939

John Clarence Moon, 57, Slater resident for the past twenty years, passed away in Wheatland, July 15, following an illness of eighteen months.

Mr. Moon was born September 22, 1882 at Annawan, Illinois, and came with his parents to Iowa at the age of one year where he lived until 1910 when he moved to Wyoming. Upon first coming to Wyoming, he lived near Wheatland, but in 1911 moved to Slater where he had since made his home. He had been mail carrier at Slater for the past twenty years.

On January 18, 1910, he was married to Leta Blanche Wissler, and to this union, two children were born, Helen and Donna. Donna passed away when a small child and his wife died in 1921. On September 21, 1923, he was married to Phoebe Howard and to this union, six children were born, all of whom survive except Iva Dell who passed away in 1937. Mr. Moon took up music in his early life and was organist of his church and Sunday school.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. J.C. Moon, six children, Gerald, Joy, James, Mary Ann, Nina and Mrs. Glen Cochran; one step-son, Charles; four sisters, Mrs. George Knuze of Alpena, South Dakota, Mrs. Mabelle Rudy of Granada, Minnesota, Mrs. Flossie Pierson of Lewis, Iowa, and Mrs. Iva Amos of Afton, Iowa; two brothers, James of Griswold, Iowa and Bernard of Atlantic, Iowa, besides other relatives.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon from the Methodist church with Rev. Noyce officiating. Interment was made in the Wheatland cemetery with Watson and Dennis in charge of arrangements.
