

Merwin G. Moore

January 20, 1923 – August 18, 2004

Memorial services were held at Emmanuel Baptist Church in Casper on Monday, Aug. 23 at 10 a.m. for long-time Wyoming resident Merwin G. Moore. Pastors Gary Skaggs and Leonard Robinson presided.

Merwin passed away Wednesday, Aug. 18 at Wyoming Medical Center. Merwin was born January 20, 1923 to Ralph Franklin and Ruth Sitler Moore in Fort Collins, Colo. He was raised on the farm and graduated Wellington High School in 1941. He continued his education at Colorado State University until he was called to the South Pacific with the United States Army, where he served until the end of WWII. He returned to Colorado where he married Katherine Smylie on June 18, 1948. He graduated from CSU in 1948 with a degree in Civil Engineering and went to work for the Wyoming Highway Department in 1948 as a project engineer in Newcastle, Wyo.

He moved to Wheatland in 1953 where he worked his way to senior resident engineer in 1958. In 1969 he was promoted to District Engineer at Casper. He

retired after 47 years with WYDOT in 1995. He held Wyoming Professional Engineer and Surveyor License No. 33.

Merwin was a member of National Society of Professional Engineers, American Society of Civil Engineers and the Wyoming Society of Professional Engineers. He was a long-time member of Emmanuel Baptist Church.

Merwin is survived by his wife of 56 years, Katherine of Casper; two sons David and Janie of Laramie, Kenneth and Kettie of Casper; one granddaughter Shannon of Denver; three grandsons Brian, Justin, Jason and their families; two great-grandsons Tristen and Luke; and one brother, Franklin of Ft. Collins. Graveside services were conducted in Wheatland at 2 p.m. on Monday, Aug. 28.
