DEATH OF SAM MOORE

The community was shocked on Monday morning to hear of the death of Sam Moore which occurred the night before at his home in this city. The immediate cause of his death was heart failure.

Samuel Alexander Moore was born in Colorado in the year 1871. About twenty-five years ago he came to Wyoming where he engaged in the cattle business, which occupation he has been identified with more or less ever since.

"Sam," as he was known to all acquaintances, was of a jovial disposition and made friends of all with whom he came in contact. His good business judgment enabled him to amass considerable of a fortune. He was always on the outlook for the interests of his town and community and spared neither time nor money to help along a public enterprise. In religion he early developed the habit of weighing things in the balance of reason and discarded that which did not conform to his ideas. His convictions, whether right or wrong, were honest and sincere.

Mr. Moore was a member of several secret organizations, prominent among which are the Masons.

In his passing his wife loses a kind and indulgent husband; the community a man who was respected and honored by his associates.

The funeral was held from the house Wednesday. Brief Episcopal services were read by Rev. A.D. Snively according to the doctrine of that church, after which the remains were taken to the Wheatland cemetery and interred in the family lot.
