

MOULDING, THOMAS
January 12, 1861-October 1, 1931

Thos. Moulding, prominent Wheatland Flats farmer, passed away suddenly at his home Thursday evening, October 1st, from heart failure.

The deceased had been suffering for a number of years from this ailment, but his condition just prior to his death was thought to have been good. He had retired before his wife and when she went to bed, she found him dead. Apparently life had passed in the kindest manner.

Mr. Moulding was born January 12, 1861 at Bingley, Yorkshire, England. He came to America in 1884 at the age of 23 and settled at Crete, Neb.

He was married to Anna May Worley, December 17, 1891, in Dorchester, Nebr. He farmed in Nebraska and Colorado until 1904 when they moved to Wheatland.

He is survived by his wife, four children; Mary Alice of Los Angles, Benjamin Clyde, Lawrence Samuel and Thomas Lee of Wheatland. Three brothers and four sisters still live in England. There are four grandchildren and two cousins.

The deceased was converted when about thirty years of age and transferred his membership to the Methodist church in Wheatland on moving here and was a faithful and loyal member until his death.

Funeral services were held from the Methodist church Monday afternoon with Rev. Orman C. King preaching the funeral sermon. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with the Lyla Watson Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.
