

MOULTON, WINIFRED CARTER
September 29, 1871-February 1, 1931

A victim of the dreaded cancer disease, Mrs. W.A. Moulton, died here Sunday, and the remains were laid to rest in the local cemetery at 2 o'clock Wednesday at the Longwith-Richards Funeral home, conducted by Rev. Chas. F. Thomas, pastor of the First Baptist church.

Mrs. W.A. Moulton was born of English parentage, to George and Sarah Carter, at Manchester, Ia., on Sept. 29th, 1871 and departed this life in her home at Wheatland, Wyo., Feb. 1, 1931, being at the time of her death 59 years, 4 months and 2 days of age.

In 1900, she was united in the bonds of marriage to Harry Walton Hamilton, of Denver, Colo., who preceded her in death in 1906. To this union, three children were born. One of whom was translated in infancy.

On the 2nd of September, 1908, she was united in marriage to W.A. Moulton in Cheyenne, Wyo. and has remained a faithful wife and companion, loyal to her Lord and a great student of God's word.

She has been a patient sufferer most all her life, but the last few years the pangs of cancer have clung to her frail form at last the disease won the battle, but not until medicine and surgery had offered all that they could to delay her suffering being aided by loving hands of friends and relatives.

Those who remain to mourn her death are her husband, two daughters, Mrs. Helen Athas and Mrs. Grace Dale, both of Wheatland, two sisters, Mrs. Caroline Head of Denver and Mrs. Adelaide Banks, also of Denver, five grandchildren and a number of other relatives and friends.

She was preceded in death by her first husband, one infant daughter and two sisters.
