

MULLEN, NELLIE THERESA  
February 18, 1884-December 17, 1944

Solemn requiem high mass was held at St. Patrick's catholic church Wednesday for Miss Nellie Theresa Mullen, 60, who died at her home at 4 a.m., Sunday, December 17. The Rev. Father Ferdinand Gruss, O.M.C. acted as celebrant; the Rev. Father Marcel Lell, O.M.C. of Glenrock, deacon; the Rev. Father Charles Zengel, O.M.C. of Hartville, sub-deacon; the Rev. Father Andrew Maas, O.M.C. of Douglas, sang mass; and the Rev. Father Othmar Miller, O.M.C. of Lusk gave the sermon. Rosary services were held in the Schrader Chapel at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday.

Miss Nellie Theresa Mullen was born February 18, 1884 in Central City, Colo. She graduated from nurses' training in Omaha, Nebr. in 1919 and went to Cheyenne where she practiced in Memorial hospital for a number of years. For the past few years she has made her home in Wheatland with her sister.

She is survived by her sister, Katherine Mullen; and two brothers, P.J. Mullen and James A. Mullen. Another brother, Frank E. Mullen of Denver, was notified of her death and died within a few hours of a heart attack. Following Miss Mullen's funeral, the family departed for Denver where services will be held Friday.

Pallbearers included Bernard Bowen, George Grant, Pat McGuire, Frank Vogt, John Gorman, and William Prendergast. Interment was in the Wheatland cemetery. The Schrader Funeral Home was in charge.
