

MULLOCK, CLARENCE J.  
September 26, 1924-May 25, 1945

The body of Pvt. Clarence J. Mullock of Torrington was brought to Wheatland Sunday for burial in the family plot, with military rites in charge of the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Clarence Mullock, Jr. was born September 26, 1924, at Torrington, Wyoming, the son of Clarence Mullock and Mattie Fletcher Mullock. He attended the Torrington public schools and graduated in 1942. He entered the service of his country on September 24, 1944, at the age of 20, inducted at Ft. Logan, Colorado and took his basic training at Camp Roberts, Calif.

He was assigned to Co. L in the 7<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division which at that time was engaged in the battle of Okinawa. He was killed in action by a Jap sniper bullet on May 25, 1945. He was posthumously awarded the Combat Infantry Badge and the Order of the Purple Heart.

He is survived by his father, Clarence, his foster mother, Gladys Fletcher Mullock, a half-brother, Robert, and many other relatives.

Services were held Sunday at the Presbyterian Church in Torrington.
