

MULLOCK, CLARENCE M.  
May 15, 1893-February 5, 1973

Clarence M. Mullock, aged 79 yrs., resident of Torrington community, passed away in the Veterans Administration Hospital, Cheyenne, at 6:30 a.m., February 5, 1973, following surgery. Clarence was born May 15, 1893 in Parnell, Missouri. He was employed as a mechanic as a young man until serving in the U.S. Army during World War I. Clarence was a member of the 89<sup>th</sup> Division, 342<sup>nd</sup> Machine Gun Battalion.

Mr. Mullock homesteaded in the Dwyer community after his discharge from the Army in 1919. He later purchased a farm north of Torrington where he has since resided. He married Mattie Fletcher in May 1922 and she preceded him in death in 1924 leaving an infant son. In Dec. 1926, he married Gladys Fletcher who survives him. Other survivors include one son, Robert of Torrington, four brothers, Virgil of Missouri, Oscar of Los Angeles, Calif., Frank of South Dakota, Clark of Yoder; two sisters, Mrs. Mary Phillips of Santa Cruz, Calif., Mrs. Catherine Wetterholm, Bakersfield, Calif., and two grandchildren. He was also preceded in death by one son, Junior in 1945, on Okinawa, and one sister, in 1962. He was a member of Veterans of Foreign Wars Post No. 2918 in Torrington of the D.A.V. Post and of the American Legion.

Funeral services were conducted Thursday, February 8, 1973, at 10:30 a.m. at the Bethel Baptist Church in Torrington with Rev. Charles Clough of Chugwater officiating, interment will be in the Wheatland Cemetery with military rites by Veterans of Foreign Wars Post No. 2918. Arrangements by Sutley Funeral Chapel of Torrington.
